


# The Elves and the Shoemaker

This term we will be looking at **numbers to 5**, representing these with objects and fingers. We will be comparing quantities, looking at the similarities and differences and will be looking at composition of numbers (how numbers are made up). This will include **wholes and parts** (3 is made of 1 and 2). We will verbally count larger numbers. Some key mathematical vocabulary we will use is:

#### **Physical Development**
