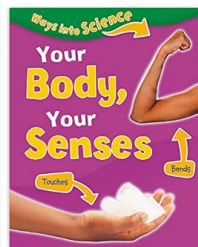
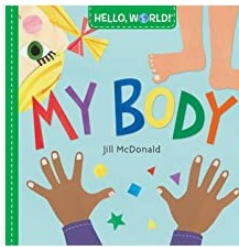
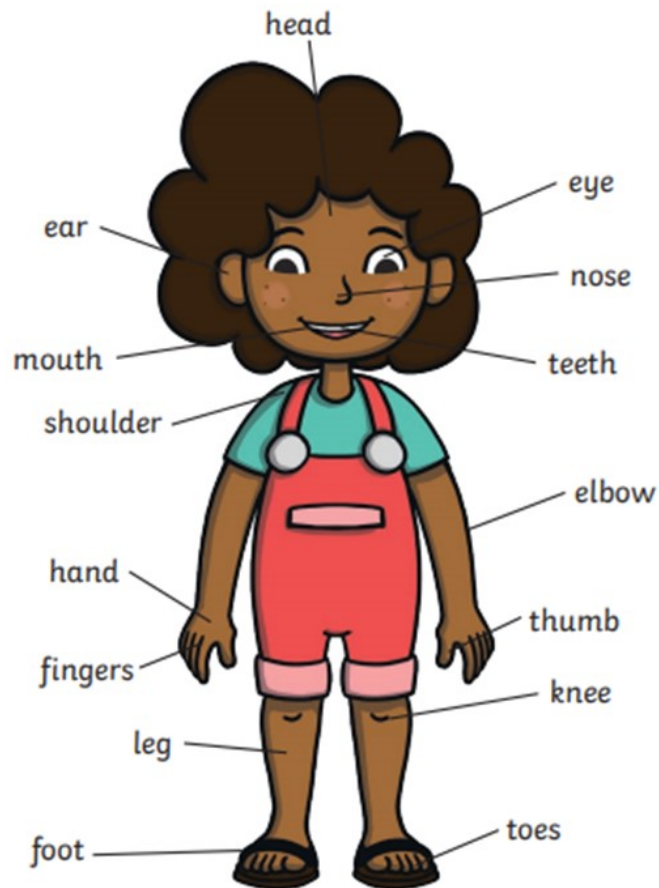

sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.
hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what different sounds are.
touch	Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it!
taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet.
smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not.

Heroes

A hero or heroine is a person who is admired because they are strong, brave or have other good qualities. Heroes can be real or imaginary.

Real—life Heroes

Real-life heroes are ordinary people who may be brave, kind, determined or generous. They set a good example to others and can be admired. People who work in the local community help others in their daily lives, such as librarians and doctors. People who work for the emergency services are heroes because they risk their lives to help others.



Florence Nightingale

Florence Nightingale, a nurse in the 19th century, became famous for her work in Scutari Hospital during the Crimean War.

What did she do?

The hospitals were **dirty and cramped** when Florence arrived. Many of the soldiers were dying of infections due to the dirty hospital rather than their injuries. At first, the doctors didn't want Florence and her nurses to help but, they set to work anyway improving the hospital.

The lady with the lamp

Florence cared for the injured soldiers and would visit them at night to comfort them. She would walk around the wards with a lamp to light her way and was therefore called 'The Lady with the Lamp'.
